





Heartland HOUSED: Springfield & Sangamon County's Strategic Plan to Address Homelessness


Vision:

Create a collaborative, unified system that provides people experiencing homelessness an equitable, traumainformed, and coordinated community system where all can access the housing and support services that each person needs to thrive.

Strategies & Key Action Steps

Strategy 1: Work Together to Address Homelessness

- Create a representative Strategy Board and increase staffing to guide plan implementation
- Improve the collection and use of data to reduce inequities and improve the system and create a two-way community communications strategy
- Respond to citizen concerns about homelessness and siting housing through information sharing and community engagement.
- Create a Lived Experience Advisory Board to ensure the voice of people with lived experience of homelessness is heard and incorporated

Strategy 2: Create Safe, Effective Housing Opportunities

- Create a cross-sector Housing Task Force to oversee and advocate for housing funding, and implement a housing pipeline
- Create more permanent housing opportunities for people experiencing homelessness
- Build capacity in the community to build, rehabilitate, and provide housing to homeless and at-risk populations
- Ensure full and **stable funding** for permanent housing projects

Strategy 3: Improve the Effectiveness of the Homeless System

- Identify and link unsheltered Sangamon County residents to crisis and permanent housing and other needed resources.
- Build diversion strategies and resources to support returning households to housing immediately
- Create stable, effective, community-wide crisis housing that serves all people experiencing homelessness.

Reaching Functional Zero for Homelessness

Strategy 4: Increase Cross-System Coordination

- Build and improve systems for cross-system collaboration with healthcare, public safety, and workforce development partners.
- Improve access to treatment and services system-wide by restructuring access and program requirements to reduce barriers (including transportation), implement best practices, and ensure welcoming, culturallyspecific, trauma-informed services.
- Create a bridge housing pilot program for those discharged from hospitals and treatment facilities.
