The sheltered count is comparable with pre-pandemic levels for our community. While COVID precautions were in place during the time of the PIT Count, many agencies were able to operate with comparable capacity to 2020 levels. The end of the eviction moratorium in IL corresponded with a local rise in demand for shelter and other housing resources. Sangamon County continues to lack adequate capacity in Rapid Re-housing and Permanent Supportive Housing programs which contributes to a longer wait on our Coordinated Entry list and longer stays in Emergency Shelter and Transitional Housing programs.

An increased emphasis on low-barrier emergency shelter practices and weekly meetings between shelters, behavioral health care providers, and outreach workers helped to reduce the number of people experiencing unsheltered homelessness in Sangamon County
