#### What is the Point in Time Count?

The Point in Time count is a count of sheltered and unsheltered people experiencing homelessness on a single night usually in January. The U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) requires that communities conduct a count of people experiencing homelessness who are sheltered in emergency shelter or living on the street or other locations not meant for human habitation.

Point in time counts are important because they establish the dimensions of the problem of homelessness and help policymakers and program administrators track progress toward the goal of ending homelessness.
