Pathway to Housing





A process developed to ensure that all people experiencing a housing crisis have fair and equal access and are quickly identified, assessed for, referred, and connected to housing and assistance based on their strengths and needs.



Individuals, families, and youth can go to any access point within the continuum to start accessing housing and support services.



Eligible Households

- **Literally Homeless**
- Imminent Risk of Homelessness
- 3. Fleeing or attempting to flee domestic violence



- 1. To consolidate and streamline the communitywide process by which individuals experiencing homelessness can request assistance in regaining permanent housing.
- 2. To create a system that identifies a pathway to permanent housing for ALL individuals experiencing homelessness, including creating one where it does not yet exist; and
- 3. To ensure that, whenever a program has insufficient capacity to serve all consumers in their potential service population, the most vulnerable individuals experiencing homelessness are served

Coordinated Entry Assessment

A screening will be completed using an assessment tool that determines a client's eligibility, needs, barriers, and strengths.



Based on the priorities set by the Heartland Continuum of Care and the coordinated entry assessment, individuals and families are placed on a priority list.

Coordinated entry referrals prioritize those individuals and families who are most vulnerable according to the Place Value Housing Scoring Model, as well as those identified as meeting the HUD definition of chronically homeless.
















Clients are matched and referred to service providers for appropriate housing that meets their needs.
